## Objectives

By the end of the programme, participants will:

- Have an enhanced understanding of core concepts relevant for the implementation of the 2030 Agenda at the local level;
- Have **increased connections** with likeminded actors from around the globe;
- Have developed concrete ideas to **improve and scale** their initiatives.

Lessons learnt and recommendations will be ready for the 2022 High-Level Political Forum on Sustainable Development.

## Methodology
